We have operated in the North-West and Northern Tablelands regions of NSW for over 30 years and have recently expanded our reach to the Mid North Coast.

Our focus is on addressing the complex challenges and issues within the social care landscape. We facilitate foster care, out-of-home care, homelessness services, family referral services and supported independent living for young people.

We carry out additional functions such as delivering tailored services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, providing support services for people with disability, and offering early education programs and training programs for young people.

Pathfinders plays an important ongoing role in supporting families, in-

dividuals and children to overcome various social issues. By taking risks to help those at risk, we are making sure no one is left behind.

Foster Care and Out of Home Care Services

Designated service providing care, support and education to young people living in Out of Home Care.

Specialist Homelessness Services

Support services for anyone that is homeless or at risk of homelessness, including a women's and children's refuge and supported accommodation services for young people.

Family Connect and Support

Assisting families and young people who do not meet the statutory threshold for child protection intervention but would benefit from accessing support to address current problems and prevent future escalations.

Inverell Family Youth Support Service

Focuses on developing family environments that value, nurture and protect children. Inverell Family Youth Support Service provides a broad range of family support, adolescent and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander services.

Support Your Path - NDIS

Provides short-term accommodation, Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA), Supported Independent Living (SIL) and community engagement services.

Pathfinders National Aboriginal Birth Certificate Program

Birth Certificate Program provides free birth certificates to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, to support improved wellbeing, employment and social outcomes.

Pathfinders Aboriginal Early Years Program

Provides Aboriginal children between the ages of 2 and 6 years with access to quality preschool and school education. Lead by a team of local Aboriginal facilitators.

The Momentum Program

Integrates three services into one cohesive program, addressing key barriers for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to improve employment rates and advance well-being.

Tilbuster Station Armidale

Support disadvantaged young people, by providing a range of agricultural, horticultural and trade skills programs such as crop and vegetable production, animal husbandry, beef cattle production, fencing, welding and building construction.

Pathfinders Annual Pumpkin Run

Pathfinders Pumpkin Run provides support to vulnerable people and communities with donations of pumpkins to local nursing homes, soup kitchens and charities that use the produce to cook hot meals for those in need.

Pathfinders operate a broad suite of programs, projects and services aiming to improve the quality of life and wellbeing for children, youth and families within the communities we service.



Out of Home Care Services

Supporting children and young people to find their Path

Pathfinders Out-of-Home-Care Services provide support to young people that require assistance living out of home. Depending on their age and needs Pathfinders offers different programs:

- Foster Care (under 18 years)
- Residential Care Program (12 -18 yrs)
- Supported Independent Living (18 – 24 yrs)
- Interim Care Model (9 – 14 yrs)
- Emergency Placement (12 - 18 yrs)

Foster Care

Pathfinders are committed to providing a supportive environment in the out of home care sector specialising in providing both foster care and kinship care. We have been supporting families for over 20 years with dedicated and passionate staff who are committed to the welfare of children, young people, and their carers. We are currently supporting over 130 carers across NSW and QLD. We pride ourselves on being flexible in our approach while ensuring that our foster carer and kinship care families have the support and guidance they need throughout their care journey and beyond.

Pathfinders is committed and passionate about community engagement and development, and assisting every individual to become a valued and contributing member within the communities in which they live.

Pathfinders work closely with the Department of Communities and Justice, local support services and professionals. We provide flexible training opportunities, dedicated case management and ongoing support for our carers so they feel supported and confident in their role.

Non Placement Support

The Non Placement Support Service (NPSS) is a fee for service program offering a range of services including Supervised Birth Family Contact, Transport, Youth Mentoring, Respite and staffing for Alternative Care Arrangements enable children and young people, aged between 0 to 18 years who are living in Out of Home Care, to interact with their parents and families in a safe and supportive environment. Out of Home Care – Residential

Our residential care program offers a place for the young person to live with the support of care staff, 24 hours a day. Care staff aim to provide all residents with trauma-informed care via a therapeutic approach. Through our delivery of the program, Pathfinders creates long-term, consistent and caring environments in which we help young people develop good health, safety, cultural and community connection, and emotional development and learning.

Supported Independent Living

The program helps to create a smooth transition to adulthood by providing young people with the opportunity to experience independent living with personalised support. It also equips them with important skills and knowledge for

living self-sufficiently. Our caseworkers and mentors provide intensive support to young people.

Rose Villa – a new Pathfinders Supported Independent Living facility

Rose Villa is a new independent living facility development located 4km outside of Armidale, New England.

The upgraded facility will have the capacity to house ten to thirteen young people who will each have their own unit. It will offer 10 units, one 3-bedroom residence and one fully self-contained unit. A combined kitchen, dining and recreational lounge area has been installed and alterations have been made to facilitate disability access to one of the units. The facility is scheduled to open in 2023.

Interim Care Model (ICM)

The Interim Care Model (ICM) refers to a model where young people aged between 9 and 14 can receive short-term care at a designated property for three to six months.

Pathfinders owns and operates an ICM property located 15 minutes from Armidale. The property includes a spacious family home. The large backyard offers residents the opportunity to interact with different types of animals, get their hands dirty in the veggie garden or harness their creativity in the woodwork shed. Our ICM property is the only one of its kind in NSW.

Short-Term Emergency Placement

Short Term Emergency Placement (STEP) is a 13-week emergency placement program for young people aged 12 to 18 years. The placement is tailored for children and young people with high needs

who cannot be immediately supported in foster care, kinship/relative care or intensive therapeutic care. STEP facilitates a 1:1 care arrangement for the young person. Pathfinders currently operate STEP houses in all our geographical areas.

Mentoring

Pathfinders' qualified support workers can provide mentoring for children and young people in Out of Home Care. Our mentors work with young people on specific goals identified by their caseworkers.

Mentors are matched to the particular needs of the child or young person, which can cover a wide range of topics. They can provide support with everyday living skills, budgeting, shopping, meal preparation, employment skills, learning to drive, connecting to culture, future planning, confidence and self-esteem building, sport or leisure activities, homework or any other areas of education that need attention.

Therapeutic Care Team

Children and young people are often affected by trauma in Out of Home Care, the level of impact depends on the severity and duration of the trauma, the support received and the child's personality and age. Even when the threat has gone, the brain may stay in a constant alarmed state. Children can show signs of trauma in situations they find stressful.

The Therapeutic Care team plays a pivotal role within our organisation by supporting our staff and carers by providing them with the training and tools they need to provide support and care for children and young people in a way that builds their resilience and helps them to heal.

Specialist Homelessness Support Services

Pathfinders Specialist Homelessness Support Services is the delivery of specialist homelessness services through the Going Home Staying Home reforms, with an increased focus on providing early intervention and access to the right support.

Armidale Youth Homelessness Support Service

Provides an outreach service to young people aged 16-24 who are homeless or at risk of homelessness and require support to improve their living circumstances or overcome barriers that may be affecting their ability to find a safe place to stay.

Support is provided for young people so they can learn the living skills they need to live independently. When young people reach their goals of living independently, we can assist their transition into a supported accommodation setting or a tenancy through social housing or a private rental.

Inverell and Glen Innes Specialist Homelessness Support Service

The Pathfinders Inverell and Glen Innes Specialist Homelessness Support Service (IGHSS) assists families, single men and women, and young people aged 16 and over.

Support services include assistance with finding stable accommodation and maintaining a tenancy, case management services, and support for those experiencing domestic and family violence. We can also facilitate access to

financial support programs, advocacy, and making connections with local service providers to overcome barriers that may be impeding their ability to find stable housing.

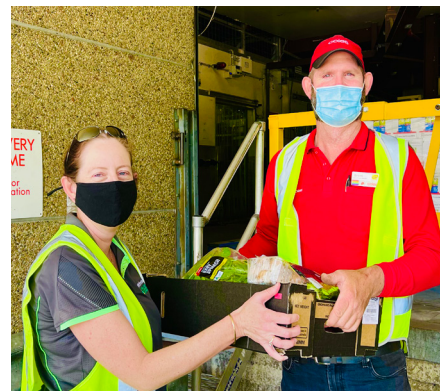
Pathfinders Armidale Youth Refuge

Crisis accommodation is available for young people aged 16-24 who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. The Armidale Youth Refuge provides short-term emergency accommodation for up to four young people at a time. The Refuge provides an environment where young people can work toward their goal of independent living or family restoration.

Inverell Women's and Children's Refuge

We provide crisis accommodation to women and children who are experiencing or escaping domestic and family violence. After-hours crisis support is available 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Accommodation and support is provided to individual women aged 18 years and over and women with children.

The refuge is set up to ensure residents' safety and well-being are both supported and provides support until they can live independently or find alternative safe accommodation.

Family Connect and Support

Family Connect and Support

In partnership with Social Futures, Pathfinders deliver the Family Connect and Support (FCS), to assist children, young people and their families who do not meet the statutory threshold for child protection intervention but would benefit from accessing support to address current problems and prevent future escalations.

The new FCS streamlines access for families, referrers, and service providers, providing consistency across the state while maintaining local-level flexibility. When connected to the service you are met

with a responsive, professionally trained FCS worker who connects clients with the right services and supports they need to tackle the issues affecting families. They take time to listen and assist each client to identify their needs. FCS welcomes families from all cultures and backgrounds, lands, and communities.

FCS is funded by the NSW Government, as a part of the Keep Them Safe action plan to improve the safety and well-being of children in NSW. Pathfinders FCS operates on the MNC, Monday to Friday during business hours.

Inverell Family Youth Support Services

Inverell Family Youth Support Service

Inverell Family Youth Support Service (IFYSS) Provides a broad range of family supports such as advocacy; skills development parenting, living skills, relationships, self-esteem and coping skills, interagency information, referrals, courses and information workshops on various aspects of family life, financial planning and the rental market, and group work development in prevention and diversion for young people at risk. IFYSS employs an Aboriginal Family Workers who work with parents and

carers of children aged 0 to 12 years covering various issues relevant to raising children. Adolescent Support Workers work with 13- to 25-year-olds on a range of issues including education, bullying, family matters, vocational training, and living skills development.

Bunbun Supported Playgroup

IFYSS educators facilitate a weekly play group that focuses on providing support to Aboriginal and Non-Aboriginal families to improve developmental outcomes for local children in Ashford NSW before attending preschool and /or school.

Support Your Path - NDIS Disability Support Service

Pathfinders Support Your Path (SYP) program provides innovative and personalised direct care supports to individuals with a disability. Our primary goal is to help participants embrace life and reach their goals, fostering greater independence while encouraging participation and learning. We are passionate about enabling participants to live their dreams and achieve the very best in their lives. We provide in-home and daily living support, community engagement, and life skills development.

In-Home and Community Supports

We offer a range of In-home and community supports designed to empower individuals with disabilities in their homes and communities. Our dedicated support workers provide personalised assistance, focusing on developing essential skills for independence.

From daily tasks at home to active engagement in community activities, these supports are tailored to meet individual goals and preferences.

Home and Living Supports

Our home and living support services, include Supported Independent Living (SIL), Short Term Accommodation (STA), Medium Term Accommodation (MTA), and Specialised Disability Accommodation (SDA). Our tailored programs aim to enhance independence, provide temporary respites, support housing transitions, and offer disability-specific living solutions.

Services are accessible to NDIS participants residing across the Mid-North Coast and New England North-West regions.

Pathfinders National Aboriginal Birth Certificate Program

PNABC is an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander program that aims to redress this issue by conducting sign-up days in towns and areas where there are significant numbers of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who don't have birth certificates.

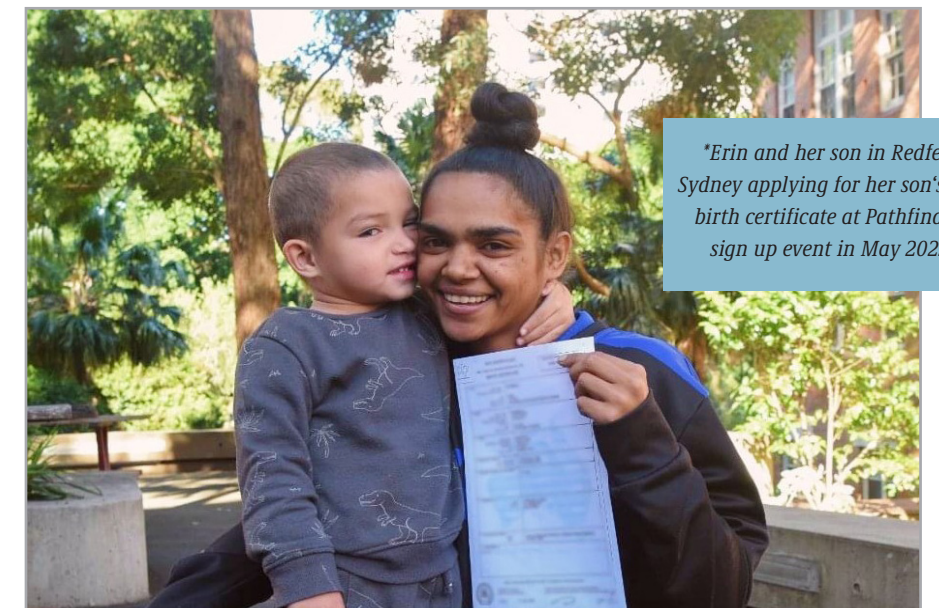
Without a birth certificate, First Nations people are excluded from many of life's important moments – driving a car, applying for a job, enrolling in school and sport, opening a bank account, voting, and accessing government services.

As of 1 August 2023, the program has supported more than 19,000 applicants with birth registration and birth certificate applications with the support of NSW Births Deaths and Marriages.

Led by our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander team, the PNABC has built a culture of trust and accountability, with participants reporting a high level of confidence in our ability to deliver the birth certificate program. Our strong reputation, experience, and established stakeholder relationships and networks within Indigenous communities have made us a leader in this field.

UNICEF Australia is able to bring unique expertise in this area, leading programs to register births in countries across the world and supporting them to improve their birth registration practices. Crowdfunding

After launching a crowdfunding campaign in 2022 to support the program Pathfinders have received donations from right across Australia and around the world from more than 3000 people. With the support received through Chuffed.org the program has been able to continue while we continue work on lobbying The Australian Government for permanent funding.

Pathfinders Aboriginal Early Years Program

Pathfinders Aboriginal Early Years (AEYP) Program is a service to provide Aboriginal children between the ages of 2 and 6 years with supported access to quality preschool and school education. Our goal is to make the transition to school as successful as possible for the child and their family.

Our emphasis is to get the children in to a formal structured Early Childhood setting, with emphasis on children attending either preschool or Long Day Care. If needed our facilitators can work on a one-on-one basis with the child and their family to make the transition in to the Early Childhood Education system fun with minimal issues. Our faci-

litators provide support and referrals to local support services to ensure all children are ready for school when the time comes.

The role of our AEY facilitators is to support the child and their family on their educational journey and to ensure that their educational experience is a positive one. Our facilitators are still available in an ongoing capacity after the child has entered preschool or school to respond to any of the families concerns.

The program is delivered in Inverell, Ashford and Tingha, Armidale, Walcha and Uralla, Gunnedah, Quirindi, Narrabri and Wee Waa NSW.

Momentum

Assisting every individual to become a valued and contributing member within the communities in which they live.

Funded by the NSW Government, the Momentum Program supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living in Northern NSW with essential support to help participants overcome common obstacles to securing employment.

Employment is critical to the health and prosperity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. For all Australians, employment offers social and economic benefits that flow to individuals, families, communities and the economy as a whole.

The Momentum consortium consists of Real Futures, Pathfinders and ACE Community Colleges. Pathfinders provide participants with birth registration and birth certificate application support, ACE Community Colleges delivers driver education services to meet the drivers licence outcomes of the project, and Real Futures provides holistic job readiness, job placement & post-placement support.

Launched in 2022 the project aims to engage and support 2,000 participants. The program is delivered across Northern NSW with participants signing up at roadshow events held at Aboriginal Community Centre and Local Aboriginal Lands Council facilities.

Gifted to Pathfinders by a private benefactor, it was their wish that the property be used for child and youth development, and the support of families.

The property is used as a venue to continue and expand upon the work that Pathfinders does with at risk youth and local families. Through this generosity, Pathfinders is working to turn this property into a multi-functional youth and family centre with long and short-term plans for renovations and construction.

With specifically designed vocational and rural skills programs, disadvantaged young people are year round participating in a range of agricultural, horticultural and trade skills programs such as crop and vegetable production, animal husbandry, beef cattle production, fencing, welding and building construction. Programs are designed to enhance the self-esteem, skills and work readiness of young people and to instil the values of belonging, mastery, independence and generosity.

Creating opportunities for young people to contribute to society through meaningful activities and employment is a core philosophy in our service delivery.

The Marie Delaney Training and Education Centre

The training and education centre provides an all-weather workshop and training facility that allows us to enhance

and expand our vocational and rural skills programs. Pathfinders conduct multiple education, training and cultural programs for young people, their friends and family, and the community at the centre during the year.

Pathfinders Pumpkin Run

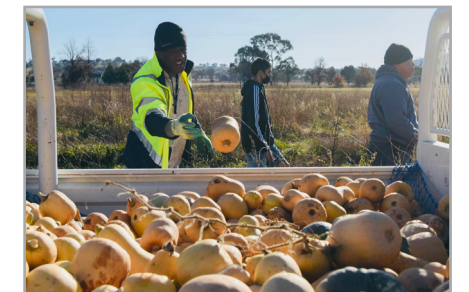
The Pumpkin Run delivers pumpkins grown at Tilbuster Station to local nursing homes, soup kitchens and charities who use the produce to cook hot meals for those in need. The Pumpkin Run is an important project, it supports the work Pathfinders' does with at-risk youth and local families. Young people gain work experience and a strong sense of community.

Through the Pumpkin Run, each year we have seen many tonnes of pumpkins and produce that have been grown and harvested by our Out of Home Care children and young people and subsequently donated to provide healthy hot meals for people in need right across NSW.
